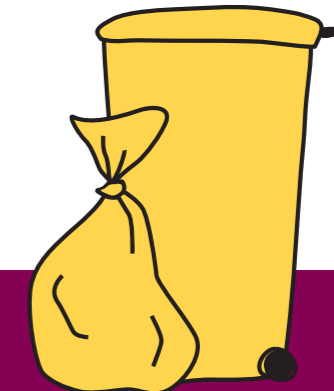


WHY IT PAYS OFF TO SORT YOUR WASTE.

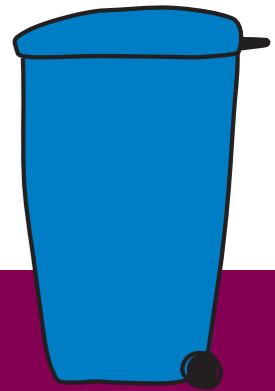
If properly sorted, a lot of waste can be used again and put back into the recycling loop.

With just a little effort, we can all make an important contribution to protecting the environment and our climate. For example, every tonne of recycled material that is used instead of newly produced plastics, prevents between 1.5 and 3.2 tonnes of greenhouse gas emissions that effect the climate (source: Öko-Institut Freiburg).

Our waste sorting habits can also have a positive effect on waste disposal charges. Because the less valuable reusable material that is wrongly placed in the non-recyclable waste bin, the lower the costs for the expensive disposal of our residual waste.

RESIDUAL WASTE

The black bin is for all waste and scrap that cannot be reused and recycled, e.g.:

- rubbish, vacuum cleaner bags, leftover wallpaper
- mirrors, ceramic discs, shards of plate glass
- nappies, hygiene products
- textile remains, cloths, rags, cat litter
- cold ash, cigarette butts, wax
- slides, cassettes, video tapes, discs
- adhesive tape, string, rubber, plastic components
- heat-sensitive paper/till receipts

The black bin should not be used for, e.g.:

- waste paper, waste glass
- tin cans, special waste
- plastic containers
- composite packaging
- organic kitchen and garden waste

IMPORTANT: The better you sort your waste, the less residual waste will be accumulated. Emptied weekly or every 14 days depending on the bin. The waste collection dates are listed in the Bad Homburg waste calendar, on our home page and our waste app.



WASTE PAPER

The blue bin is for, e.g.:

- waste paper and cartons
- paper forms, writing paper
- cardboard, paper packaging
- catalogues, brochures, exercise books, newspapers magazines, pictorials, books without covers

The blue bin should not be used for, e.g.:

- hard and water-resistant paper
- aluminium foil, plastic, styrofoam
- heavily soiled and thickly coated paper
- waxed and oiled paper
- parchment and tissue-paper products, nappies
- beverage containers
- heat-sensitive paper/till receipts

IMPORTANT: Please dispose of non-soiled paper only, and tear up bulky cartons. Emptied every 14 days. The waste collection dates are listed in the Bad Homburg waste calendar, on our home page and our waste app.

WASTE GLASS

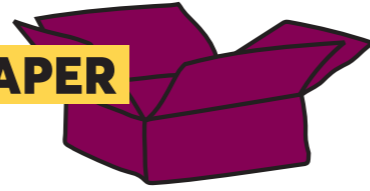
The bottle bank is for:

- empty bottles and jam/preserve jars (sorted into white, brown and green glass)
- blue waste glass belongs with green glass

The bottle bank is not for:

- non-glass material
- plate glass, mirrors, ceramic, porcelain

IMPORTANT: Please clean bottles before disposal, and note the waste disposal times on the containers. The locations of the containers are listed in the Bad Homburg waste calendar, on our home page and our waste app.



PACKAGING

The yellow bag/the yellow bin is for sales packaging e.g.:

- plastic containers
- styrofoam packaging
- plastic bags and non-returnable bottles
- foil, (yoghurt) containers, aluminium foil
- composite packaging, e.g. Tetra Paks
- metal packaging, e.g. tins
- foamed plastics

The yellow bag/the yellow bin should not be used for, e.g.:

- waste glass or waste paper
- wooden or plastic children's toys
- non-packaging materials, e.g. nappies
- non-packaging plastics, e.g. buckets, flower pots
- kitchen waste, scrap metal, special waste

IMPORTANT: You do not have to rinse out packaging, but it should be empty. Collected every 14 days. The waste collection dates are listed in the Bad Homburg waste calendar, on our home page and our waste app.



BIO-WASTE

The brown bin is for, e.g.:

- fruit and vegetable waste
- raw and cooked foodstuff leftovers
- coffee ground and tea leaves, filter papers, egg shells
- meat and sausage remains, nut shells
- wood chips (clean), kitchen paper
- green cuttings, weeds, potted plants, greenery

The brown bin should not be used for, e.g.:

- plastic bags, packaging made from plastic or metal
- vacuum cleaner bags, cigarette butts
- rubbish and nappies
- harmful substances and poisons
- cat litter, pet litter
- soil and stones

IMPORTANT: Please wrap wet bio-waste in newspaper. Place your bin in a shaded area. These will be emptied weekly. The waste collection dates are listed in the Bad Homburg waste calendar, on our home page and our waste app.
